MWorks at Kirton Wood

Nottinghamshire Wildlife
Trust sent the following
about recent works in
response to concerns
voiced to them by visitors
to Kirton Wood

Over the past couple of months, visitors to a number of Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust's ancient woodland nature reserves.



including Kirton Wood, will have noticed the felling of trees as part of our long-term efforts to enhance these vital habitats for wildlife and to restore traditional coppice management.

In addition to carrying out long-term habitat restoration cutting back, or 'coppicing', a proportion of the trees on a cycle of between 7-20 years, the Trust has been removing remaining areas of non-native conifers and carrying out vital safety work.

As well as making safe trees affected by the recent storms, we are tackling trees seriously affected by Ash Dieback Disease where they are growing close to paths, tracks and boundaries. Once made safe, some areas will be replanted, whilst others will be left to regenerate naturally. Where possible, timber will be retained on site to form valuable deadwood habitat. Away from boundaries and access routes, diseased trees will be allowed to die naturally to provide even more habitat for. invertebrates and fungi.

Five decades of woodland protection

Halting the destruction of the county's remaining ancient woodlands was a key focus in the early days of the Trust. Beginning 50 years ago, land purchases mean we now care for over 200 hectares of ancient woodland in the county, including Kirton Wood.

Left unmanaged, our woodland reserves would become dark and impenetrable, threatening the delicate patchwork of habitats that makes them so special. Wildflowers such as bluebells and woodland orchids would be shaded out, dormice, now spreading out from some of our north Notts woodlands, would lose access to hazelnuts and other woodland fruits, and many birds would have nowhere to nest.

Using traditional skills, we work to maintain and enhance our ancient

woodlands for wildlife. Small sections would be repeatedly coppiced to produce different materials, without killing the tree. For a few years after coppicing, open areas of the woodland floor are rich in flowers. As trees regrow, these areas become crowded with shade-tolerant species like brambles unless the management cycle starts over. Traditional 'coppice' management ensures that some clearings remain within the woodland for wildflowers, such as the iconic bluebell, and insects like butterflies to flourish, which in turn feeds the birds. The lush regrowth also protects ground-nesting birds, while any dead and decaying timber feeds fungi and provides both food and shelter bats, invertebrates and woodpeckers.

As modern materials replaced traditional timber, the ancient craft of coppice management declined or stopped altogether. Woods became increasingly shaded; many species began to die out and those that could began to relocate. In addition to restoring and extending traditional coppice management, keeping our woodlands open to and safe for visitors in the face of the impacts of Ash Dieback Disease is a real challenge.

Caring for these wildlife gems comes at a significant cost and increased pressures on these precious places means we must do more. Our fundraising appeal to help meet the rising cost of caring for these special places launched earlier this year has so far raised over 90% of our £25,000 target but there is still time to donate at nottinghamshirewildlife.org/ancientwoodland.



New Gates at Newark Town Lock

The Canals and Rivers Trust have replaced the lock gates in Newark, near the castle, starting early this year. With the new ones installed and before water flooded back into the lock, they held an open weekend to enable people to see the results. According to the Newark Advertiser, about 5,000 people went along.

Fortunately it was a glorious weekend. Workers installed special walkways to enable people to descend safely to the floor of the lock.

The new gates, made of European green oak, are 5.5m (about 18ft) high and very impressive at close quarters. They were constructed at the Trust's own workshops in Yorkshire and brought to the site in a five day journey by water before being lifted into position using heavy cranes.

The old gates were sent to be recycled. Some of the wood is too rotten, but what can be used is turned into a variety of useful items.

The Trust has a 25 year rolling programme of works for the locks in their care in England and Wales, so it will be a long time before a similar opportunity comes round again.

The Newark Heritage Barge was moored just outside the lock and was also open to visitors. They have an impressive display of items, photos and records of the life of the barges which were the lifeblood of commerce before being superseded by trains and lorries.

Our Annual General Meeting was held on Wednesday
April 13th in the Village Hall. During the closure
because of Covid, the National Executive took the decision to move
the date of all WI AGMs to April from December. We were welcomed
to the meeting by our President.

The business part of the meeting was dealt with first. Two members had joined East Markham WI for their annual party and had enjoyed the event.

Our River Group Meeting will be held on Tuesday 24th May at East Markham, when the entertainment will be provided by Phil Rylance. This will be followed by supper.

Three members attended a workshop at County House to tackle 'Crochet for Beginners'. Deaf Awareness Week takes place from 2nd - 6th May and there will be a talk on the subject at Southwell.

The County Spring Council Meeting was held at Oxton in March. One of our members represented us and gave a good report on the morning meeting. She was also presented with a certificate to mark our WI's 60th Anniversary during the meeting.

The County Quiz will be held at multiple venues on the same evening in May. We have a team entered at our nearest venue, which is Ollerton.

Forthcoming events include a Willow Weaving workshop, where members can try to make a willow sphere. Three members have applied to join and have a go. Croquet at Southwell and Clay Pigeon Shooting at Orston were other events members wanted to attend. There is also an opportunity to attend T20 cricket at Nottingham, where there will be two games to see in one day.

Our County Committee tries to organise a lot of events for members throughout the county. It must be a very challenging job and we are grateful for all the opportunities they provide for everyone.

As it was our Annual General Meeting, the Annual Report was read out and the Financial Statement was passed round. This had been prepared by our Treasurer, Sally, and audited by one of our Independent Financial Examiners.

Members were asked if they would like to vote for a new committee. It was a unanimous decision to vote the outgoing committee back into office en bloc

Subscriptions were due for the forthcoming year. A decision was made by the committee to reduce the subs again this year by £10 per member, but the National and County portions of the subs still have to be paid.

We then moved on to discussing the Resolution which is to be presented to the National Annual General Meeting, which this year is to be held in Liverpool. The Resolution is to raise awareness and encourage funding for work to help 'Women and Girls with ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder) and ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder), who are going undiagnosed.'.

The Resolution proposes that more funding should go into research of these conditions in women and girls. It is mainly men and boys who are affected, leading to women and girls being overlooked. The result of our vote will be passed to our representative who will vote at the meeting.

All members can propose a resolution. Members from all over the country put forward their suggested resolutions to their county Federations who send them to the National Federation. The selection is narrowed down to five. This one came top when members all over the country voted for the one they felt most appropriate and worthwhile.

We also took the opportunity to discuss what will happen going forward as things get back to normal after the pandemic. We considered what speakers we could have and also what social evenings we could have for the village.

One idea for a speaker was a lady who comes to speak about 'Sign Language for the Deaf' and then teaches the audience to sign some words. We thought this would be very interesting and that we could make it an open meeting for anyone to come along.

Another Fashion Show was suggested as this had been very successful last time. Members had enjoyed a 'Bingo and Fish & Chips' evening pre-Covid and it was suggested we might hold one.

In June we are serving afternoon tea in the Village Hall to celebrate HM the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

After the business we enjoyed a supper to finish the evening.

Our speaker for our May meeting, which will be on Wednesday 11th May, will be Janet Whittaker-Holmes, who will demonstrate 'Origami', after which we hope to have a go.

Do You Have a Carer's Emergency Card?

The word 'carer' is widely misused to refer to a person who is paid to provide care to somebody. The legal definition, which was achieved after many years of effort by people caring for relatives and loved ones, defines a carer as:

"anyone, including children and adults who looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction and cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid. Children who care are called 'young carers'.

Many carers don't see themselves as carers and it takes them an average of two years to acknowledge their role as a carer (See the NHS website: Understanding Carers).

What is an emergency card for carers?

An emergency card for carers identifies you as a carer in the event of an emergency. It gives no personal information, but provides a phone number anyone can call. Staff answering the phone will take any action you have agreed with the County Council such as:

- ☑ contact family/friends to let them know there is an emergency
- ☑ visit the person you care for and arrange emergency help.

Why do I need an emergency card?

In the event of an emergency you will have:

- ✓ emergency cover 24 hours a day
- peace of mind that in the event of an emergency the person you care for will be looked after.

Who can apply for a card?

You can apply for an emergency card if you are:

- ☑ a cared for person living in Nottinghamshire (excluding Nottingham City) and over 18 years-old.
