## From the Registers - Burial

The funeral of one of our long-standing village residents took place on Friday 14th of April 2023 in Saint Michael's Church Laxton.

Margaret Mary Madison was born on 17th December 1936 and sadly passed away on Saturday, 25 March 2023 in Tuxford Manor Nursing Home.

The service was attended by her family, friends and many village residents past and present. The service was conducted by our Lay Reader, Joan Wood. The burial took place in the churchyard next to her parents.

## RAKARAKA

Margaret lived her whole life in Laxton. Her home from birth was the Post Office and general shop. She had a younger sister, Nora, and not long after Nora's birth their father died. Their mother kept the business going, and both Margaret and Nora worked there.

Margaret attended the village school next to her home and her mother would lift her out of the side window directly into the school yard. She used the same window to supply hot buttered toast as well.

Margaret took the business on after her mother retired, little knowing then that she would be the village's last Postmistress. She and Nora worked there together supplying the needs of the village and even

mastering the new computerised system the Post Office introduced. Nora continued to help even after her marriage and the two were together when the Post Office finally closed in Laxton in March 2008.

Janet Cooke has many memories of times spent with Margaret. She recalls that:

'Together with Mr Edwards' shop at the top of the village, 'Post Office & Shop' were two of the most important places in the village. We used to get our sweet ration from Mr Edwards and we often visited Post Office as well. These were very busy places in our childhood as the village was more self - sufficient then. Only sometimes we went into Retford on a Saturday to do extra shopping such as fancy goods, clothes, etc.

For more or less, as long as I can remember, Margaret had been church organist following, I think, Eddie Howe. In those days, we had a church choir and her grandfather, Mr Moody, was part of it . Margaret played for services with Brenda Bagshaw (now Chambers) playing for Sunday School.

In our younger days Margaret and I used to go dancing. Dances were held in a lot of local villages and in Retford. On one occasion we attended one in Worksop and popped next door to the Chinese restaurant in the interval! We once went to one in Skegness on a Saturday night and then drove back home. I had a few hours sleep before I went to work the next day! Oh to be young again!

We decided to restart the tradition of decorating the pillars in church. My husband, Frank, used to go up the ladder to attach string to the pillar tops and wind it around and down the pillar.

The rest of the helpers, Dean and Mark Sayer, our daughters Ruth and Clare and Jean all passed reeds and berries up for him to attach. On one occasion Dean said to Margaret "Can't we have some music?" so she played 'When the Saints Come Marching In" on the organ along with a selection of other tunes.'

Given her long association with the church and its music, we can only ponder how amused Margaret would have been to know the drama unfolding behind the scenes during her funeral. Graham Laughton, another lifelong villager and church organist, was playing on the day, but he soon discovered that the organ wasn't performing as it should. The compressor was not filling the bellows with air.

A relay of four strong men, Mark Hennell, Stuart Rose, Geoff R and

Edwin S discreetly slipped behind the scenes to operate the manual pumping system, which pre-dates the electrical system. It was fortunate that it was intact.

The cause of the failure was the electrics to the boiler that supplies the heating having tripped the compressor circuit breaker. The only warm members of the congregation were the pumping party, but they ensured that Margaret had a suitably musical send off.

Never people to rest on their laurels or to plan a quiet weekend, Nottinghamshire Young Farmers decided to arrange an event which would be a personal challenge for those taking part..

The goal was to raise awareness of Young Farmers and to raise money as well as awareness for three

dementia charities - Forget Me Nots at Tuxford, which provides support to people with dementia in our area, Dementia UK and the Alzheimer's Society.

The original suggestion was made to cycle the 60+ miles from near their county office in Collingham to Skegness for the East Midlands weekend of competing and partying there in March.



There was an enforced last minute change of plan when the snow returned at the precise date they were to set off. They wisely decided that not only would it be unpleasant, but also potentially unsafe to attempt it. It was agreed to go on the next available, and snow free, weekend.

After diaries were checked, the final group taking on the challenge was a team of six, three each from Tuxford and Collingham.
Unsurprisingly, given her reputation for never asking someone else to do something she would not do herself, County Chairman and

Laxton lass Jessica Rose, joined Vicki Banks and Katie Gent as the Tuxford YFC trio.

Fortunately the only meteorological challenge on their rescheduled date was a gusty and rather chilly side wind which proved 'interesting'. Knowing them, this much overused word hides the fact that it proved quite a challenge at times, but they all came through fit and well.

The group left Collingham at 8.30am and the ride took them just 5 hours. They reported feeling 'fantastic' by the end. It was a great opportunity to catch up with the friends and relatives who had made the journey to welcome them and to refuel with seaside-fresh fish and chips.

After some fun on the slot machines and a well deserved rest, they all enjoyed a rather more relaxing trip back with bikes safely stowed in vehicles. No doubt long, hot baths were enjoyed by all back at home.

Jessica is becoming the 'go to' person for local radio to interview about Young Farmers Activities and she was live on Lincs FM the day before the ride to promote it. By then they had already raised £1,000 towards their target of £3,000. At the time of going to print, the total is now £2,800 and still rising. **Dawn Chorus Walk:** After the dancing Stuart Rose leads a walk round the three open fields to listen to the birds calling. On previous occasions around 30 species have been identified.

It is not something you can do everywhere and the walk is a great chance to learn more about the famous three field farming system surrounding your new home. Everyone is welcome. Please note that you need to be able to walk safely over rough ground. The whole event is on working farming land.

# Laxton Visitor Centre Trust Commemorative Tree Planting

At a recent Trustee meeting it was suggested that we plant a tree in the village to commemorative the reign of HM Queen Elizabeth II 1952-2022

Thoresby kindly donated a fine oak tree and it was officially planted



on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> April at 1.30pm on Main Street just below Step Farm.

The planting was undertaken by Emeritus Professor John Beckett, a lifelong supporter of the Laxton Open Fields farming system and the Laxton

Community. He wrote his book on the History of Laxton in 1984 when the future of the village was under threat and is also responsible for the film shown in the Visitor Centre, of which he is a Trustee. He is currently revising the Visitor Guide booklet which is available for purchase in the Visitor Centre.

In attendance were Sir John Starkey, Chairman of the Trustees, Professor John Beckett, most of the Visitor Centre Trustees and a number of villagers. Unfortunately Gregor Pierrepont was unable to attend.

There was also a good turnout of villagers established and new, enabling a group photo to be taken. It was not quite on the scale of the 1986 photo of the planting of the tree on the green, but records an equally significant occasion for the village which should long outlive all present on the day.

Following the official planting a number of Trustees added their own spade full of soil to the hole before Chris from Thoresby finished the job and hammered in the supporting stake and plastic shield to



protect the young tree while it gets established.

You will be delighted to know that we raised just over £800 for Village Hall funds, so we should be able to pay the electricity bill this year if nothing else.



## **Laxton Traditions - Rogation Sunday**

Rogation is one of the lesser-known festivals in the Anglican Church. It is an ancient festival to seek blessing 'for a community and its sustenance.' The word *Rogation* has its origins in the Latin verb *rogare*, (to ask). We see the same root in the word *interrogation*.

The Sixth Sunday of Easter (the fifth Sunday after Easter Sunday) is traditionally known as "Rogation Sunday". The date is arrived by working backwards from Ascension Day, which is 40 days after Easter.

Easter Sunday is counted as the first day and so Ascension Day falls on a Thursday. The Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of the week following Rogation Sunday are known as the "Rogation Days" and they are the three days preceding Ascension Day. The Rogation Days were traditionally days of fasting and abstinence devoted to asking for God's blessing on agriculture and industry.

Since mediaeval times there has been a tradition of "beating the bounds" of the parish, praying for God's blessing upon the crops at Rogationtide. The purpose of this was to re-establish the boundaries and reinforce them in the minds of the community.

There are varying accounts of what happened. Some say that the elders of the parish would walk the boundaries beating landmarks with whips or saplings. Others say that the priest would go round the boundary with the village boys and subject them to a beating at specific spots, which would fix the places in their memories! While barbaric, there was science behind this because it has since been proven that memories of trauma are often firmly associated with the place where it occurred.

In recent times, this parish has always celebrated Rogation Sunday with a procession and service in the open air, usually on the Common to the west of the village - and no young people were hurt in the process. The current shortage of clergy makes it difficult to continue this tradition, but it is to be hoped that it will not be lost.

The essence of Rogation is to ask for blessing – for a particular place; for those who live and work there and for everyone's efforts to create a thriving community. Rogation invites everyone to join in asking for the success of the community and also to pledge to their part in achieving it.



# **Wellow Maypole Celebrations**



The annual Maypole Celebrations in our neighbouring village of Wellow are nearly upon us once again. Newcomers to the village may not realise that this is a major date in the area's calendar and can draw over 2,000 people.

This year's Maypole Day at Wellow on May 29th marks 100 years of recorded history of the village's maypole celebrations! In 1923 the Marchioness of Titchfield crowned the village May Queen, and in 2023 there will be two crownings during the month of May – King Charles III in London and the new May Queen in Wellow!

The highlight of a full afternoon of family fun and activities is the crowning of the new May Queen by her predecessor. Earlier in the year the new Queen is elected in a secret ballot by the people of Wellow but her coronation is by no means the only thing on offer.

The green around the huge permanent maypole in Wellow is turned into an arena for activities and entertainment. This begins at 12 noon with a parade headed by the retiring May Queen and travels from the west end of the village into the arena.

The surrounding area is full of craft and produce stalls, opportunities to buy some tasty snacks and to have a go at the excellent raffle. There is something for everyone – stalls, crafts, exhibits, live music and entertainment, children's swing boats, Morris dancing, ice cream, hot and cold food, and the famous home-made cake stall.

A display of interesting vehicles of various vintages fills the bank on the

opposite side to the swing boats and bouncy castle, with an ice cream van

strategically positioned between them.

The highlights of the day are always the children's procession, the crowning of the May Queen and the ever popular maypole dancing. The May Queen, her retinue and the dancers gather at St Swithun's Church to change into their traditional costumes. The small dancers wear pretty dresses with white aprons over and garlands in their hair. There are various roles for the older ones to carry out. The Herald walks ahead of the procession doing her best to get a note out of a bugle, the posy bearer and crown bearer carry flowers and a coronet of forget me nots for the new and retiring May Queen respectively while pairs of girls carry hoops of colourful flowers.



The party forms a procession to walk down the yard of the Red Lion pub to



the arena for the ceremony, the dancing and the mischief created by Wellow Jack and his Bogies. These trouble making newcomers first appeared in 2009 and have now become firm favourites. Who would believe that you needed to train young boys and the occasional girl to create mayhem!

Free parking is available

close to the green. Visitors are encouraged to purchase a programme to support the funds of the Maypole Committee as this there are a lot of hidden costs in staging the event, not least road closures and substantial insurance. The whole event would not be possible without the efforts of the many dedicated volunteers, which include a number of former May Queens.

Wellow Maypole Day is a unique and much loved tradition in Nottinghamshire – come and be a part of the celebrations, buy a souvenir programme, have a flutter on the raffle or tombola, and maybe take home some delicious cake!

In the next few weeks there will be opportunities to visit a number of local gardens under the National Gardens Scheme. In May there are three which are guite close to our immediate area:


