

Laxton History Group



We started the March meeting with the news that we have received a certificate from the Air Ambulance thanking us for the £500 raised at the Craft Fayre in November.

In February John Millin had been our speaker and he asked that his fee and any donations for copies of his book be sent to the British Normandy Memorial. Mary asked the Group's approval to send £50 in addition to the £55 given in donations and this was agreed.

Our speaker in March was Maggy Watkins, talking about Katherine Swynford, whose life is mostly remembered for her scandalous affair with John of Gaunt.

Daughter of a knight from Hainaut, Katherine came to England when Philippa of Hainaut married Edward III. She was orphaned young and brought up at the English royal court. She was taken into service later with Blanche of Lancaster, the first wife of John of Gaunt, Duke of Lancaster.

Aged about 12, she was married to Hugh Swynford, one of the Duke's knights. After the death of Blanche, Katherine became the lady-in-waiting of her daughters, and also took care of them.

After the death of Hugh Swynford in 1371, she became a member of the household of the Duke's new wife, Constance of Castile, and she was given her late husband's property in Lincolnshire: Coleby and Kettlethorpe Hall, which was prone to being flooded by the Fosse Dyke. There was a church there, which has now disappeared but stained glass from it is now in the church at Messingham.

John of Gaunt began an affair with Katherine which scandalised society. After Blanche's death in 1368, John did not marry Katherine, but made a marriage of convenience with Constance of Castille. She came to live in Britain while John found Katherine a position near him in France so they could continue their affair.

After the Peasant's Revolt, when John lost much property to the rebels, he asked for forgiveness and went back to Constance. He also signed a 'quit claim', giving up any claim to the property he had given Katherine.

Katherine and John of Gaunt had at least four children, who received the surname Beaufort after one of their father's French estates.

Despite the formal break, Katherine's relationship with John and the rest of his family remained good. In 1387, she was made a Lady of the Garter by King Richard II, a position shared with Constance. In the early 1390s, Katherine and John resumed their affair. Constance died and after a 24 years affair, John unexpectedly married Katherine despite her having no title. In the same year, a papal bull was received, recognizing the marriage as valid, and all their children were legitimised. John died three years later and Katherine moved to Lincoln, where she remained until her death four years later.

Katherine has her tomb at Lincoln Cathedral, which is now much less grand than it was originally, although Maggy said her body lies beneath rather than in it.

Helen is thinking about destinations for our July outing and is asking for suggestions. We hope to decide soon.

We have both our AGM and a speaker in April, so we agreed that the meeting should start early. This meeting takes place on 16th April, and so will be reported in the June edition.

On May 21st we will be hearing about 'Lord Byron of Newstead Abbey' from Denis Hill.

Threads Through the Bible Exhibition at Southwell Minster - Ending 5 May 2025

incredible that one person created the whole display. There are 44 huge textile panels making up the three parts of the exhibition. The idea that the artist conceived the idea and managed to design and create the images is amazing. Each has various needlework techniques including applique and machine embroidery using a wide range of fabrics, which add to the story telling. Helpful panels by each work explain what is depicted. It is certainly something not to be missed.

New Exhibition at Lakeside, Nottingham

Professor John Beckett has drawn our attention to the following event:

Country Lives: exploring the English countryside from 1800.

This is an exhibition convened at Lakeside, University of Nottingham, by the Department of Manuscripts and Dr Sarah Holland of the Department of History. It is open now and runs until 21st September.

This exhibition, which is in the Weston Gallery, does what it says on the tin and is very well worth visiting if you are in the vicinity. The main question is what have we done with the countryside over the past 200 years. It draws heavily on the resources of Manuscripts and Special Collections, and is free to access. since we placed our February order, taking it lower than it has been for three years. In the event it was members running low which chose the timing of the order this time.

As it was more expensive than we hoped in February, but showed signs of going up, group members were given the option of ordering if they needed to, with the offer of a further order 4 - 6 weeks afterwards, depending on the price trend. Several opted to do this, hence running low now.

By the time of the order the price had gone down quite steeply then levelled off and had reached 54.55p inc. VAT (52p ex VAT). We purchased for **49.94p**. The summer order will be in late July / August depending on members' needs and the price trend.

Draft Minutes of the Meeting of Laxton & Moorhouse Parish Council 28/01/25

Present: Councillors: S.Hill (chair), J,Hill, M.Hennell, S.Rose; A. Moorhouse; R. Creighton

In attendance at parish council meeting

C. Wilson (Clerk); M. Pringle (County councillor)

Members of the public (x1)

- 1. **Apologies for absence:** Mr Sheard's apologies were accepted. Mrs Michael was not in attendance.
- 2. **Declarations of interest:** There were no declarations of interest, direct or indirect, in any items of business on the agenda.
- 3. Dispensations: None required.
- 4. 10 Minutes public speaking: Nothing raised.
- 5. Thoresby Estate report (if any): No report.
- 6. **Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 26 November 2024:** The minutes of the parish council meeting held on 26 November 2024 were agreed as a true record and signed by the chair
- 7. Matters arising: There were no matters arising.
- 8. Reports from district and county councillors: Mrs Michael was absent.

In his report, Mr Pringle referred to the following in particular:

- a. The local government re-organisation
- b. NCC budget developments
- c. NCC adult social care issues.
- 9. Reports from councillors: Mr S Hill reported that he had attended the Safer Neighbourhood Group meeting earlier in January. This had taken place at a new venue, Sutton Village Hall. Very little criminal activity had been reported by the police at the meeting, the main issues being speeding traffic in villages and petty crime.

Councillors considered Mr Sheard's written report (copy appended) referring to flooding, the 2025 litter pick, sports field, Glebe field, Christmas lights, lamppost poppies, speed limit at Moorhouse and potential parish council aims and objectives. Councillors felt that, taking account of the existing statutory and regulatory framework governing the parish council, meeting time should be preserved for the significant matters currently requiring consideration.

There were no other reports.

10. Property matters including sports field, condition report and Glebe

Field matters (if any): The Thoresby Charitable Trust's decision on the funding application was still awaited.

Mr Rose reported a query regarding the boundaries for which the licensee was responsible. The clerk will check the terms of the licence and let Mr Rose know. She will also report the hedge overgrowing the footpath alongside Glebe field.

The clerk will diarise the next sports field inspection for summer 2025.

11.Planning matters:

- a. Applications: None.
- b. To note planning decisions by NSDC: None.
- c. Great North Road Solar Park Update and consider contribution to planning consultant report to be commissioned by the local Joint Parish Council Action Group (JPAG): Councillors appreciated that Moorhouse residents had been very active in relation to the proposals and consultation, noting, in particular, their comprehensive objections submitted to GNR and open letter to the parish council.

They discussed the residents' petition asking the council for a contribution to the JPAG consultants' costs commensurate with the council's financial constraints taking account of:

- 1. The other councils which had agreed to contribute, including Weston, and the respective amounts each was being asked to pay
- 2. The survey results
- 3. The basis of the residents' objections
- 4. The extent and proximity to residential properties of the land affected in Moorhouse
- 5. Moorhouse's proximity to the open fields and conservation area and impact on Laxton's surrounding character.

Councillors unanimously **decided** that the parish council should contribute an amount to be determined later under item 13 on the agenda (Financial matters).

d. **Compliance:** The clerk will chase NSDC regarding the fence at Croftways.

12. Defibrillator:

- a. **Inspection report:** Mr J Hill confirmed that the pad expiry dates were 18 May 2024 and 28 August 2025 respectively. Councillors **decided** that the clerk should order one pair to replace the expired set.
- b. **Replacement defibrillator and funding:** After discussion, councillors **decided** that the replacement defibrillator should be installed in the phone box. The clerk will research funding opportunities for a suitable device.

- c. **Provision of first aid kit:** The clerk will explore the availability of dates for a spring event
- 13.Flood resilience working party Report and any associated decisions: Councillors noted from Mr Sheard's report referred to at LMPC/9/25 (Reports from councillors) that NCC did not have capacity to provide support at this time and that he had contacted GNR regarding flooding and natural flood management
- 14. Christmas event 2024 Parish council Christmas event group Event report: Councillors were grateful for the £200 donation from Thoresby Charitable Trust. All agreed that the event had gone well although the order of events could be tweaked going forward. All were pleased with the appearance of then trees. Mr Rose reported that the Village Hall Committee also felt that the event had been a success. The clerk will add the purchase of new Christmas lights to the September 2025 agenda.

15.Parish environment and appearance, including:

- a. Parish roads and pavements: Nothing discussed.
- b. **WWI and WWII remembrance memorial on the Green:** Councillors noted from Mr Sheard's report referred to at LMPC/9/25 (Reports from councillors) that new lamp post poppies would be required for November 2025.

Mr Pringle suggested that the council approach ATTFE to ask if their students would make a community memorial as a project. The clerk will make a request.

c. Parish environment enhancement in recognition of previous serving parish council members: Deferred

16. Financial matters:

- a. Financial position as at 31 December 2024: Councillors considered and noted the clerk's report showing the precise financial position at 31 December 2024 (incorporating the 2024-25 budget figures) which the chair cross referred to the bank statements. Councillors **agreed** that the CIL levy should be applied to the purchase of the Moorhouse bench which cost £484.96. They also asked the clerk to approach the Thoresby Charitable Trust for funding for a new defibrillator.
- b. **Approve clerk's salary:** Councillors had noted the NJC salary increases at the meeting on 28 November 2024 (RPC/151/25) and approved the implementation of the increase.
- c. **2025 26 insurance arrangements:** Councillors unanimously **approved** the 2025-26 insurance arrangements.
- d. Accounts for payment: Councillors unanimously approved twelve payments totalling £1,783.02. Councillors noted the amendments required by HSBC in relation to the change of

signatories mandate. The clerk will deposit the amended paperwork with the Newark branch.

- e. **Appointment of internal auditor:** Councillors regretted that the Halam parish clerk was no longer undertaking this role for a further year. After discussion, it was **agreed** that Mr S Hill would approach a local resident with a financial background.
- f. To consider the financial information provided by the Clerk and NSDC's letter regarding 2025/26 precept estimates and to agree the precept for the year ending 31 March 2026: Councillors considered the financial information provided by the clerk. Taking account of, in particular:
- 1. The absence of any increase in the precept for the past seven years and increase in costs in that time
- 2. The withdrawal of the referendum requirement applicable to precept increases in excess of 5%

councillors **decided** by a majority of 5:1 to increase the precept to $\pounds 4,830$.

Councillors reverted to the amount of the contribution to the cost of the JPAG consultant's services deferred at LMPC/11/25 (Planning matters – GNR solar park). They discussed at length the contents of J. Saunders's email sent 10 January 2025, the clerk's calculation of the council's anticipated financial position taking account of all prospective income and expenditure, the council's financial position, reserves and financial constraints. Following some confusion in relation to the basis of an initial vote, councillors voted 3:3 on the proposal that the council should, contribute the full amount requested by JPAG, £1,075, towards the cost of the consultant's support. The proposal was **carried** on the chair's casting vote in favour of the proposal. It was unanimously **agreed** that the:

- i. contribution should be funded temporarily from the election reserve which will be topped up incrementally each year until election year
- ii. the council should make representations to Elements Green and NSDC incorporating Moorhouse residents' submissions already made.
- 17.**Service faults:** Mr Rose will provide the clerk with a photo of and what3words for a blocked mains pipe down the side of Ide Farm
- 18.**Correspondence:** All items of correspondence noted. The clerk will post details of NSDC's Crop Drop scheme received after circulation of the agenda on the Website and Facebook page.
- 19.5 minutes public speaking time: Nothing raised.
- 20.Agenda items for next meeting: See above.
- 21.**Date of next meeting:** 7.00 pm Tuesday 26 March 2025 at the Visitor Centre.





Citizens Advice gives advice on Council Tax

With millions of households across the

country dealing with a rise in bills this month it is important to make sure you are paying the correct amount of council tax.

You might be able to pay less council tax depending on your circumstances.

You might be able to get:

- discounts for example, for a single person or an empty property
- Council Tax Reduction (CTR) if you have low income
- a different reduction if you can't get much CTR

Check if you can get a discount on your council tax

You might get a discount automatically on your council tax bill. If you're not sure whether you're already getting a discount, check your bill or contact the council. If you're not getting a discount, you might still be entitled to one. It depends who lives in the property.

Check if you can get a single person discount

If you're the only adult in your home, you'll get a 25% discount on your council tax bill.

When working out how many people live in a property, some people aren't counted - they're called 'disregarded people'. To find out more about who is classed as 'disregarded' you can check our website **www.citizensadvice.org.uk** or give us a call on **0300 5610330**.

If everyone who lives in the property is disregarded there's still a council tax bill, but it will have a 50% discount.

If everyone in your home is a student or severely mentally impaired, you won't pay any council tax.

If you're entitled to a discount because someone has moved out, tell the council. You're entitled to the discount from when the person moved out, even if you told the council later.

Check if you can apply for Council Tax Reduction

If you're on a low income you might be able to get your council tax reduced. If you get benefits or have other people living with you, this might affect how much your council tax is reduced by.

Your local council will ask you details about your income and your circumstances, so they can work out if you're entitled to Council Tax Reduction (CTR). They will then work out your new bill and tell you how

much council tax you need to pay.

If you have other people living with you who are aged 18 or over, you might all be responsible for paying council tax. Only one of you needs to apply for CTR.

If you're awarded CTR, you won't normally get an actual payment. The council will reduce the amount of council tax you have to pay.

Check which CTR rules apply

Which rules apply usually depends on whether you've reached State Pension age.

- If you're under State Pension age, the 'working age rules' apply.
- If you've reached State Pension age, it depends if you or your partner get certain benefits.

The working age rules still apply if you've reached State Pension age and you or your partner get:

- Universal Credit
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Income Support

If you've reached State Pension age and don't get any of these benefits, the 'pension age rules' apply.

If the working age rules apply

Your local council can make its own rules about who's entitled to CTR and how much you'll get.

You'll need to check with your local council to find out if you're entitled to CTR. It's likely that you'll have to pay something towards your council tax bill.

If the pension age rules apply

Your local council will need to work out your income to see if you're entitled to CTR and how much CTR you might get. If you have a partner, the council will also include their income.

You'll also need to have less than £16,000 in savings and property - this is called 'capital'.

You can get CTR with more than £16,000 in savings and property if you get the guarantee part of Pension Credit.

These are just a few of the ways in which you may be eligible for a reduction in your council tax bill.
